

## What is Export Control?

Export Control Laws regulate the transfer of controlled unclassified technology, information, and commodities, including software, to prevent the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction. The United States Government also restricts the release of such sensitive unclassified, export controlled information (ECI) to foreign nationals here in the U.S. (also known as “deemed export”). Thus, release, disclosure or discussion of ECI to a non-U.S. person is considered an export and is prohibited without authorization from the KCNSC export control office.

## Export Control Regulations

The U.S. Departments of Energy, State, Commerce, and Treasury are the primary administrative branches that govern the export control lists. Each of the Departments is responsible for different areas of export controls. Non-compliance with export controls can result in severe monetary and criminal penalties against both an individual as well as the company.

Suppliers are responsible for the security, protection, and handling of export controlled information that may be shared with them. A supplier’s policies should describe “how” the supplier internally restricts access from foreign persons.
