1. GOVERNMENT FURNISHED PROPERTY REPAIR OR CALIBRATION (Clause C-13.2) (June 2025)

Government Property

The Buyer retains title to all Government-furnished property, as identified in the table below, until properly disposed of, as authorized by law or regulation. Government-furnished property means property in the possession of, or directly acquired by, the Government and subsequently furnished to the Seller for performance of an Order. Government-furnished property includes, but is not limited to, spares and property furnished for repair, maintenance, overhaul, or modification.

Property Management

The Seller shall have a system of internal controls to manage (control, use, preserve, protect, repair, and maintain) Government-furnished property in its possession. The system shall be adequate to satisfy the requirements of this clause. In doing so, the Seller shall initiate and maintain the processes, systems, procedures, records, and methodologies necessary for effective and efficient control of Government-furnished property. The Seller shall disclose any significant changes to its property management system to the Buyer prior to implementation of the changes. The Seller may employ customary commercial practices, voluntary consensus standards, or industry-leading practices and standards that provide effective and efficient Government property management that are necessary and appropriate for the performance of this Order (except where inconsistent with law or regulation).

The Seller's responsibility extends from the initial acquisition and receipt of property, through stewardship, custody, and use until formally relieved of responsibility by authorized means, including delivery or other disposition, or via a completed investigation, evaluation, and final determination for lost property. This requirement applies to all Government-furnished property under the Seller's accountability, stewardship, possession or control, including its vendors or subcontractors.

The Seller shall include the requirements of this clause in all subcontracts under which Governmentfurnished property is furnished for subcontract performance.

The Seller shall establish and maintain procedures necessary to assess its property management system effectiveness and shall perform periodic internal reviews, surveillances, self-assessments, or audits. Significant findings or results of such reviews and audits pertaining to Government-furnished property shall be made available to the Buyer.

Use of Government Property

The Seller shall use Government property, either furnished or acquired under this Order, only for performing this Order, unless otherwise provided for in this Order or approved by the Buyer
